Hahndorf Farm Barn

Hahndorf Farm Barn is a unique blend of a children's farmyard and wildlife park. You can hold, touch and feed most of the animals in complete safety and at your own comfort level. There are many activities for kids at the farm and you can easily spend hours there enjoying quality time with your family.

National Motor Museum

Shannon Street, Birdwood | 8568 4000

The National Motor Museum boasts one of the largest, finest and most important collections of cars, motorcycles and commercial vehicles in the world. The collection comprises over 300 vehicles dating from the turn of the century to the present day. The museum is also the recognised centre for the recording of all aspects of road motor transport history in Australia. It is for this reason, among others, that the National Motor Museum enjoys an international reputation.

The Big Rocking Horse and Toy Factory

452 Torrens Valley Road, Gumeracha | 8389 1085

The Big Rocking Horse and the Toy Factory share the same site at Gumeracha, in the northern Adelaide Hills. Climb the biggest rocking horse in the world, feed the native and farm animals in the wildlife park and discover an incredible range of wooden toys, games and puzzles made on site. Lots of picnic spots available or there's an onsite cafe to enjoy.

Monarto Zoological Park

Monarto Safari Park is the largest in Australia and one of the largest in the world. It is a 1,500 hectare open-range sanctuary undertaking a major role in breeding programs for rare and endangered species. It is the home of South Australia's first ever southern white rhinoceros and Australia's largest giraffe herd. The Zu-loop shuttle bus runs every day of the year, enabling you to get on and off the bus at a variety of wildlife viewing platforms including, Giraffe, Rhino, Cheetah, Lion, African Painted Dogs and Chimpanzee.

Wallis Cinemas, Mt Barker

The Stirling Golf Course

One of the great pleasures of playing golf at The Stirling Golf Club is the wonderful course environment. Even if you hit a duffed shot, you can at least take solace in soaking up the natural beauty that surrounds you.

Mt Lofty Botanic Garden

Summit Rd or Piccadilly Rd, Crafers

The crescent-shaped Mount Lofty Botanic Garden is situated on 97 hectares on the eastern slopes of Mount Lofty. The cooler, wetter location suits plants from temperate climates which are difficult to grow on the Adelaide Plains. Amongst the native Australian flora there are tree ferns, as well as exotic cultivated plants from cool climates including Rhododendron and Magnolia and the National Species Rose Collection.

Cleland Conservation Park

Cleland Conservation Park conserves a vital area of natural bushland on the Adelaide Hills face and includes the internationally popular Cleland Wildlife Park, the viewing platform of Mt Lofty Summit and scenic Waterfall Gully. The area has a rich history of Aboriginal occupation and European settlement.

Beerenberg Family Farm

Mount Barker Road, Hahndorf | 8388 7272

There's nothing like the taste of freshly picked strawberries. It's hard to describe the juiciness and flavours – you won't get it from any supermarket! Hunting through the patch to find the perfect strawberry is a great family activity. It's become an Adelaide institution during the warmer months, usually from November to April.

The Cedars

Enjoy a visit to the historic home of Sir Hans Heysen one of Australia's most famous artists. Nestled among the majestic gum trees which featured in many of his paintings. Visit his studio which has largely remained undisturbed since his death in 1968. Open between 10am and 4 pm. Guided tours available.
